SCHOOL COMMUNITY: St. Ignatius College Preparatory, founded in 1855, is a four-year coeducational college preparatory school conducted by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), a religious order of the Roman Catholic Church. Located in the Sunset District of San Francisco, St. Ignatius draws students from within the city limits and also from Marin County, the Oakland-Berkeley area, and the San Francisco Peninsula.

The student body reflects a rich ethnic and social diversity. In 2007, the **student body** includes 1427 students of the following ethnic groups: 64% white, 20% Filipino/Asian, 9% Latin, 4% African American, and 3% other. 20% of the students receive financial assistance. **Admission** is by entrance examination, recommendations, and elementary school grades. The average entrant is approximately two years above grade level on standardized tests.

Of the 108 **teaching faculty**, 81% hold a Masters degree or beyond. The **average class size** is 22.

ACCREDITATION & AFFILIATIONS: Accreditation is by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges; St. Ignatius holds membership in the Jesuit Secondary Education Association, College Board, National Association of College Admissions Counselors, and the National Catholic Education Association.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: The academic program at St. Ignatius is designed to prepare students for college. A student must pass a minimum of six academic courses each semester, in addition to completing a community service project of 100 volunteer hours prior to graduation. **Upon completion of requirements, seniors will graduate on May 31, 2008.**

CLASS RANK/GPA: Because St. Ignatius has a rigorous college preparatory program, a cumulative ranking system based on GPA does not fairly represent a student's relative achievement. **Therefore, St. Ignatius does not rank.** However, to assist college admissions offices in evaluating performance, statistics from the Class of 2007 are provided on the reverse side. **Grade Point Average** includes all courses except summer school courses (taken at other high schools) and courses where students serve as a Teacher's Assistant. The transcript includes both weighted and unweighted GPA. The *weighted GPA* gives an extra point for honors and Advanced Placement courses.
