

INTRODUCING DASH... Daily Academic Support Hub

- Daily at lunchtime for students missing work (Assigned and Mandatory!
 - Students with missing work at the end of the quarter will receive an "incomplete" in that class, which is not a passing grade.

- Afterschool on Mon-Thurs.
